

Disaster Recovery Plans

State of Alaska Department of Health and Social Services

The purpose of this guide is to prescribe policies and procedures governing DHSS's roles and responsibilities in assisting the Governor and the Alaska Division of Homeland Security and Emergency Management, Department of Military and Veteran Affairs (DMVA) (under the State of Alaska Emergency Response Plan) and the Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) (under the State and Regional Oil and Hazardous Substance Discharge Prevention and Contingency Plan, i.e., the Federal/State Unified Plan and the ten subarea plans), to respond to, or assist in recovery from, disaster emergencies (to include weapons of mass destruction (WMD) incidents).

This Plan defines the policies, scope, operations, roles, responsibilities, and authorities that form the foundation of behavioral health response to disasters and emergencies. The purpose of the Plan is to coordinate behavioral health emergency services with other federal, state, and local disaster response and recovery organizations that may mobilize to any foreseeable event within Alaska.

State of Alaska Division of Spill Prevention and Response

The Southeast Alaska Area Contingency Plan (SEAK ACP) represents a coordinated and cooperative effort by government agencies. This document contains information applicable to pollution response within the Southeast Alaska Captain of the Port (COTP) Zone. The U.S. Coast Guard (USCG) and the Alaska Department of Environmental Conservation (ADEC) have written this Area Contingency Plan jointly. It meets the pollution response contingency planning requirements under the National Contingency Plan (NCP) and the Alaska Regional Contingency Plan (RCP) applicable to the State and Federal government.

Alaska Department of Environmental Conservation

The Disaster Response Plan describes the Alaska Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) responsibilities and procedures for assisting the Department of Military and Veterans

Affairs (DMVA), Division of Homeland Security and Emergency Management (DHS&EM) in responding to various disaster emergencies under the State of Alaska Emergency Operations Plan (EOP). The plan ensures a coordinated effort to provide assistance to first responders, communities, local and tribal governments, and State and Federal agencies in the response and management of disaster emergencies.

University of Alaska Southeast Emergency Planning Resources

The Juneau campus has a system for immediate emergency notifications. Students can use this system to leave a very brief message that will be broadcast campus wide. Example: "A delivery truck crashed in the courtyard outside Mourant and is leaking gas." Before using this system, make sure that the user — or someone with them — calls 911 to call for help. Using this system allows students to send an immediate message, campus wide. Use of this system is appropriate for situations in which there is an immediate danger to people on campus.

City and Borough of Wrangell

In recent years, local hazard mitigation planning (HMP) has been driven by federal law. On October 30, 2000, Congress passed the Disaster Mitigation Act of 2000 (DMA 2000) (P.L. 106-

390) which amended the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act (Stafford Act) (Title 42 of the United States Code [USC] 5121 et seq.) by repealing the act's previous mitigation planning section (409) and replacing it with a new mitigation planning section (322). This new section emphasized the need for state, Tribal, and local entities to closely coordinate mitigation planning and implementation efforts. In addition, it provided the legal basis for the Federal Emergency Management Agency's (FEMA's) mitigation plan requirements for mitigation grant assistance.
