7 Strategies to Maximize Application Success

- 1. Apply with single best project
- 2. Ensure alignment of project with grant program eligibility and merit criteria
- 3. Address project readiness criteria
- 4. Include complete and realistic project schedule and budget
- 5. Demonstrate financial commitment, political support, and partnerships
- 6. Plan ahead
- 7. Develop grant team

Clear description and statement of benefits



Data-driven content



Easy to read text, maps & graphics



BCA in alignment with latest guidance



Engage funders, political/stakeholder support




NEPA is appropriately scheduled



Project is scoped to fit the grant criteria




Application is complete and submitted on time



Pre-Positioning is Key to Grant Success

- Evaluate projects for match to grants
- Prioritize projects for application: *Readiness, Eligibility, Merit*
- Develop multi-year application strategy
- Position individual projects to pursue grants

→ Data analysis is the centerpiece

address barriers to accessing affordable transportation options and help bring measurable transportation benefits to disadvantaged communities per Justice40


Analytical Outline

Adding Equity into BCA

- Builds upon the BCA to incorporate additional perspective
 - Weights benefit based on income
 - Results generate distributed, equity value
 - Methodology aligns with research and economic theory

\$ means more to lower income persons than higher income persons

Potential Match Sources

- State or Congressionally designated spending authorization
- Local sales tax or bonds
- Loans i.e., state revolving loan fund, federal loans
- Business investment
- In-kind contribution personnel, goods, services, space, and utilities contributed by applicant or a non-federal third party
- Atypical options
 - Environmental mitigation credits
 - Donated ROW
 - Value of equipment necessary for project
 - Pre-award activities funded through non-federal sources
 - Philanthropic or individual donations
