
Southeast Alaska Transportation Plan Update



- 20-year multimodal plan to guide future public investments in transportation infrastructure in Southeast Alaska
- Improve mobility for residents, goods, and services throughout Southeast Alaska, considering area's unique transportation needs and challenges
- Includes all transportation modes, will integrate with the recently adopted Alaska Marine Highway System Long-Range Plan
- Last update was adopted in 2004, so a lot of changes to consider!



SR Design/Construction Delivery Results




Yearly Average Obligated Construction Funding 2020-2023	\$100 M




